
What we Have Been up to This Term



Past pupils Savini and Sachini popped into school to say hello and leave some Christmas presents for staff. It was lovely to see them.



Message From Our CEOP

WhatsApp

The Whatsapp chat messaging app is great for groups to keep up with coordinating their social plans and to share information. However it is not designed for use by children. There have been instances at St John's where children have been marginalised and felt left out of conversations, or picked on and bullied. Learning to communicate in group chats is a skill most preteens don't have and need to develop. Please think very carefully about allowing your child to use this app.

If your child does already use the App, it is important to find time to check their phone and understand the tone of the messages. I have this page of advice useful https://www.parentcircle.com/how-to-stop-cyberbullying-on-whatsapp-classroom-groups/articled

In addition I suggest that if children do use the app then they first show their parent/carer how to block someone and to rehearse how they would tell you that they feel uncomfortable. Examples of unsuitable behaviour, the signs to look for and how to evidence and report such incidents are all mentioned on the above link.
